Scam Alert

Neighbourhood Watch Scotland

The infographic below shows some of the most frequently reported doorstep scams in Scotland:



The most common types of work that doorstep scammers carry out are roofing, driveways, gardening and services such as gutter cleaning or pressure washing. They may tell you that:

- They are offering a special deal on driveways / gardening / roofing / maintenance. The deal is only available today.
- They have noticed that your roof or property exterior needs urgent repair work done to it they are available to start work on it straight away and can offer you a good price.
- They have just completed similar work at other houses in the local area.
- They have building or gardening materials left over from another job and can offer them to you at a discount.

Please be alert when approached at the doorstep with any such offers and best to politely decline the offer.
