Annual Subscriptions and Wheelie-Bin Stickers

Subscriptions of £1.00 by members of the Watch are normally due at this time of the year and will be collected by your local Look-Out Distributors.

At the time of collection members should receive two wheelie-bin stickers with the updated blue and white Watch logo. The stickers should be applied to any side of the grey (waste) and green (recycling) bins. Stickers should not be applied to the brown (garden) bin as these bins already have a sticker (collection permit) as supplied by City of Edinburgh Council.

If you are not at home at the time of collection you will receive an envelope with a 'Sorry you were Out' note with contact details of your Distributor. Please place $\pounds 1$ in the envelope and return to your Distributor who will in return drop off your stickers.

What Happens with Annual Subscriptions

From subscriptions collected, over the next two or three years the Committee is looking to replace the numerous street lamp-post signs with the updated blue and white Watch logo. Subscriptions also cover the cost of the publication and distribution of Look-Out newsletter as well as some other running costs related to Watch matters.

Scam Alert

Neighbourhood Watch Scotland

In 2021, over **20,000** people reported falling victim to scams that involved fraudsters remotely connecting to their computer, with losses totalling over **£57m**. Police Scotland is working with City of London Police and TeamViewer to run a national campaign to raise awareness of these scams.



Scammers often pretend to be calling from an organisation you trust such as Microsoft, Amazon or your broadband provider. They may already have some of your personal details such as your email address.

They may ask you to

- download software to allow the caller to 'fix the problem' remotely
- visit a link to allow the caller to 'run a test' on your device
- visit a 'secure website' to download an upgrade
- download an app to your mobile phone to check your broadband speed

Action to take:

If you receive an unexpected call about a computer problem, hang up and don't provide any information. Never follow instructions from an unsolicited caller or in a text message to download an app or software which would allow them to access your computer remotely.

Contact your bank immediately if you think you may have made a payment to a scammer or if you are worried that a fraudulent transaction has been made from your account.

'Anti-scam' scams

This is a call from someone claiming to be from a charity supporting scam victims, a company selling anti-scam technology, or from someone demanding money to renew your <u>Telephone Preference Service</u> registration, which is actually free. Be alert to all of these scams.
