### Fireworks and Bonfire Safety

This year, as in previous years, the weeks surrounding the 5<sup>th</sup> of November will place considerable demands on the Police, the Fire and Rescue Service, local health services and council services across the city. Many people are needlessly injured and a great deal of nuisance is caused to the public due to the misuse of fireworks and the irresponsible building of bonfires.

Bonfires are often constructed in inappropriate places, near to people’s homes or businesses or built to such a size that they present a danger to life and property. The supply of fireworks to youths under 18 years is not only illegal but can also lead to dangerous incidents.

Lothian and Borders Police are working closely with our partners within the Fire and Rescue Service, council services and local health services within our local communities to reduce the potential dangers to the public by;

- removing any unauthorised bonfires that pose a threat to life or property
- educating children and young persons about the dangers of fireworks
- ensuring the retailers involved in the sale of fireworks act responsibly
- identifying individuals involved in the misuse or illegal sale and supply of fireworks

By working closely with partner agencies and local communities Lothian and Borders Police aim to ensure that the people of Edinburgh can enjoy the 5<sup>th</sup> of November festivities safely.

## CRIMES AGAINST PREMISES



Between the 10<sup>th</sup> and the 17<sup>th</sup>, a shed in Heriot Watt was entered and a number of rugby balls stolen.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> a theft shoplifting took place at a premises in Corslet Place where a number of deodorants were stolen.

On the 19<sup>th</sup>, a laptop valued at over £2000 was stolen from Heriot Watt University.

On the 6<sup>th</sup>, a male entered premises in Lanark Road West, stole a rucksack and left unnoticed. The rucksack and contents were found nearby.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> an overhead projector was stolen from a premises in Heriot Watt.

## CRIMES AGAINST THE PERSON

On the 19<sup>th</sup> a teenager had her mobile phone stolen.

As mentioned in my special bulletin last month, bogus workmen have been operating in the area. An elderly gentleman from Bryce Road fell foul of the fraudsters when he had a driveway laid... Badly..!!!

In the early hours of the 1<sup>st</sup>, a male was assaulted in Juniper Avenue and sustained a cut to his head for which he received stitches.

## VANDALISM

- 27<sup>th</sup>, Pentland View, damage to motor vehicle.
- 24<sup>th</sup> – 25<sup>th</sup>, Muir Wood Road, cracked window.
- 15<sup>th</sup>, Palmer Road, damage to car.
- 18<sup>th</sup>, Forthview Road, cracked window.
- 12<sup>th</sup>- 16<sup>th</sup>, Pentland View, damage to car.
- 14<sup>th</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup>, Palmer Road, 2 cars damaged.

## MOTOR CRIME

Between the 11<sup>th</sup> and the 13<sup>th</sup>, 2 x cars had their registration plates stolen.

On the 7<sup>th</sup> at 0530hrs a car window was smashed and a car entered. Nothing was stolen.

Overnight on the 5<sup>th</sup> a Citroen motor car had its front nearside wheel stolen.

## SOLVED CRIMES

Just after midnight on the 20<sup>th</sup>, a male was attacked by a group of youths. A 17 year old male has been identified and has been charged with serious assault.
